Dear Parents and Caregivers

I would like to begin my newsletter this week by thanking all the students and staff who have contributed to Project Compassion this year. Our Project Compassion collection has raised \$1300 so far this term (but we are still counting) and the competition is fierce with all Pastoral Care Classes vying to raise the most money. As mentioned last week the funds raised will benefit many people in many countries who have far less than us. Caritas through Project Compassion aims to assist people in many countries; people who have been affected by civil war and who have been forced to leave their homes consequently suffering poverty; those who live in slums built on land affected by landslides; those who live in areas where their homes are constantly threatened by natural disasters such as typhoons, cyclones, floods, earthquakes and tsunamis; those who don't have access to appropriate medical care and medicines as well as those who have been dislocated from country and culture in order to access lifesaving health care. Many Thanks to parents for supporting their students in their endeavours to raise funds.

Easter is the most significant time in our lives as Christians, with Easter Sunday being the most important day. Without Easter, our faith is meaningless. The Easter story captures the very essence of our existence and I encourage you to participate in the life of our church during this time. Please try and attend at least one, if not more, of the Easter liturgies. The Easter Mass times for the Petrie Parish appear later in the newsletter. Yesterday, the College walked to Our Lady of the Way Church to participate in our Easter Liturgy. The liturgy was a powerful reminder of the meaning of Easter. Congratulations to the students for their excellent behaviour and attention at this significant event. I would like to pass on our thanks to Mrs Janelle Doohan and Mrs Alison Whitten for their preparation of the liturgy and to all the students who played a role in the drama giving it significant meaning. As Easter approaches I am hopeful that students remember the events of Holy Week, hopefully ensuring the true reason for Easter is at the forefront of our thinking.

Reports are currently being prepared by teachers so that they can be sent home in the mail during the holidays. If you do not receive a report for your son or daughter by the end of the holidays, please contact the College Office. As part of the feedback to parents on how their students are progressing at school, Parent – Teacher interviews will be conducted on 30 April 2014. All bookings are done on-line and correspondence will be sent home during the holidays with reports indicating the process for making appointments. Parents will be able to access PTO from the first day of Term 2 to book interviews and I would recommend that all parents make appointments to see their student's teachers. As students will benefit from the conversation between the teacher and the parent, **students are expected to attend with their parent(s).**

This Friday our Year 8 students will have an excursion to Pine Rivers Park on Friday to celebrate their contribution to the College Community over the past term. Students will leave school after morning tea and return in time for transport home. Letters have been sent home with all details earlier in the week.

Last week I congratulated our new P and F Executive. This week, John Dangerfield, our new P and F President has written an article for our newsletter and I commend that to you. Please note our next P and F meeting is in the first week next term (Wednesday 23 April).

Continuing on our theme from the last few weeks, I have included several other websites and YouTube clips about cybersafety. Each of them has some important information for you and/or your student. Please encourage your students to view them too.

The [website Meet the Creeps](http://www.meetthecreeps.com) is an interactive site that provides young people with fast feedback on their attitudes and behaviour about cyber safety. The Creep Quiz has been developed by Telstra and the Queensland Government. The following YouTube clip draws a parallel between Facebook and inviting a stranger into your home. 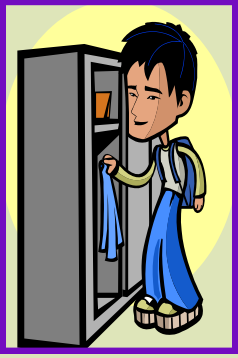

Lockers



As with previous years, **ALL LOCKERS NEED TO BE EMPTIED** on or before Friday and have their **LOCKS REMOVED**. This allows students to clean out the lockers and also discourages theft and vandalism. If there are any locks still on the lockers after Friday, the locks will be cut off and any books etc. will be placed inside the Pastoral Care classrooms.

And just as a reminder, could you please check with your child that their spare locker key has been handed to their PC teacher? This allows your child access to their locker should they lose their key or accidentally leave it at home.

They may also leave their lock here with their PC teacher during the holidays if they wish.

Hair Colour & Cuts

As after every school break, if students have coloured their hair during the holidays, it must be close to, or identical to, the student's natural hair colour on their return. Any 'unusual' hair styles must also be corrected (for girls, hair needs to be tied back if shoulder length, and for the boys, length needs to be above the eyes, collar and ears).

Failure to adhere to this simple request will mean that the student will be sent home and will not be allowed to return to school until the colour, cut or both is fixed. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.



Similarly, there should be no 'extra' piercings on your child's returns – this includes clear studs and covers like Band Aids.

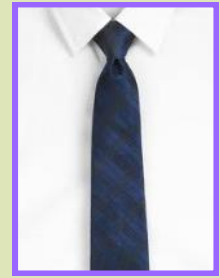

Ties Term 2 & 3

As we are now in the 'cooler' months, all male senior students are expected to wear their ties, not only here at school, but also to and from the College.

For the junior male students, the tie is an 'option' during this time, but they must still own one, and must wear it when directed (e.g. special celebrations, masses, excursions, school photo day, etc).



College Jumpers/Blazers



All students are allowed wear the College blazer (though it is compulsory for senior students to have one) but they are also expected to wear either the College jumper or fleeced, nylon jacket when cold. Other tops are not permitted, and after one or two warnings, may be confiscated. If your child is unable to wear the correct College uniform on any given day, please write a note in your child's Planner explaining the situation. Also, if there is any difficulty in purchasing the correct uniform, please contact us so that we can be of assistance.

May I reiterate that the College has a strict uniform policy, as most parents expect, and all students and parents have agreed to abide by this policy. There is virtually no reason for any student to be out of uniform on a casual basis – your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.



Correct Shoes

Along a similar vein is the wearing of incorrect shoes: the shoes for the formal uniform are black, hard-leather, polished lace-ups (*not* black, soft-leather skate shoes, ballet slippers and the like). Shoes for the sports uniform are sports shoes/runners.

Unfortunately, we are currently seeing an explosion in skate shoes (e.g. "Vans"). Apart from being the incorrect uniform, for both the formal and sports uniform, they do not provide safety and adequate support for HPE.

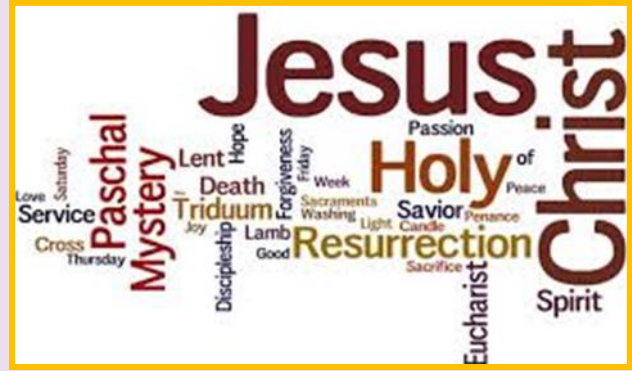

Humility, Simplicity and Modesty

Holy Week Liturgy

Yesterday we gathered as a school community for our Holy Week Liturgy. As a community we focused on the theme of the call that Jesus' cross makes on us. We reflected on the story of Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection by watching a re- enactment of these events known as the Stations of the Cross.



The traditional Stations of the Cross follow fourteen events of Jesus' suffering and death, followed by a concluding reflection on the Resurrection. The story was told through the eyes of Jesus' mother, Mary. This story calls us to remember the suffering of Jesus in a particular way. The symbols and coloured fabric surrounding the cross were reminders of the darkness and pain attached to the suffering and death of Jesus. The symbols of darkness and death were then removed and replaced with colours and symbols representing the Resurrection of Jesus. From the hopelessness of death, we recognised that rich new life springs forth.

On Easter Sunday, Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. For Catholics, Easter Sunday comes at the end of 40 days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving known as Lent.

*Through his suffering and death, Christ gives us lasting freedom.
 May God bless us with the inner freedom
 To live ever more truly the Good News of the Gospel.*

Celebrate this Easter with a heart filled with peace, joy and happiness. May our lives be touched by the true meaning of Easter.

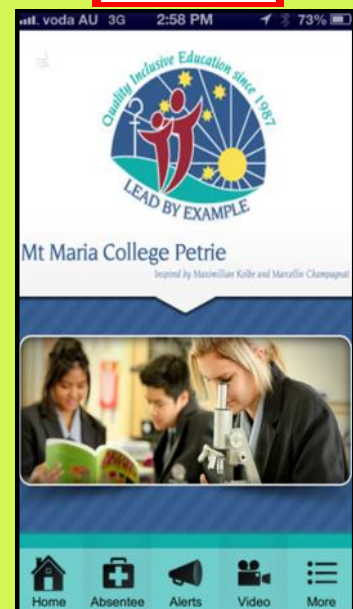

And those words hold true for committees such as ours at Mt Maria College.

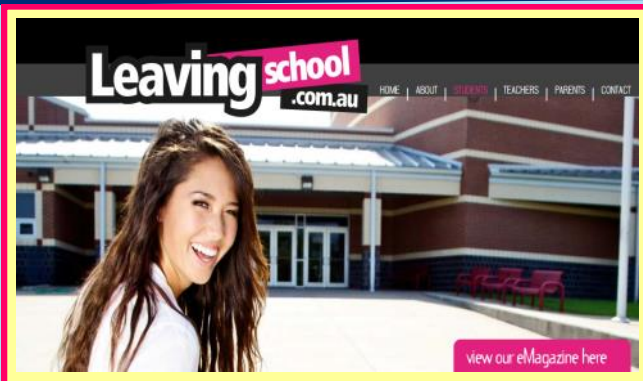

St Vincent de Paul's Winter Blanket Appeal

"Squares for Charity"



The time has come for students, staff, and relatives of Mt Maria College Petrie Community to start knitting or crocheting squares of 25 cm. These squares are then joined together to make colourful blankets, which will be donated to St Vincent de Paul in June. Last year, we were able to donate 25 blankets to the St Vincent de Paul's Winter Blanket Appeal.

We will also need some help with assembling the blankets, so if you are able to give us some of your time to assist with crocheting the squares together, please contact the College Office on 3285 5500.

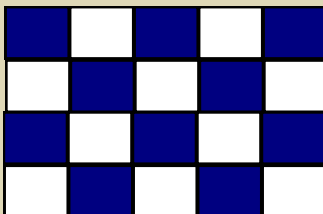
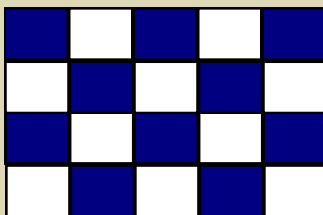
For the blankets to be put to use this winter it would be ideal if we could have your finished squares before the 24th of May.

To get you started you will need:

- 1 set of 4 mm knitting needles or 1 x 4 mm crochet hook
- Some 8 ply balls of colourful yarn
- Squares need to measure 25 cm x 25 cm, with between 52 - 58 stitches and 70 - 75 rows of knitting.
- It is also helpful when making the blankets if you can leave 40 cm of yarn at the cast on and cast off point.
- If you need materials, they can be provided.
- For those who may not be able to knit, donations of yarn or money will be very much

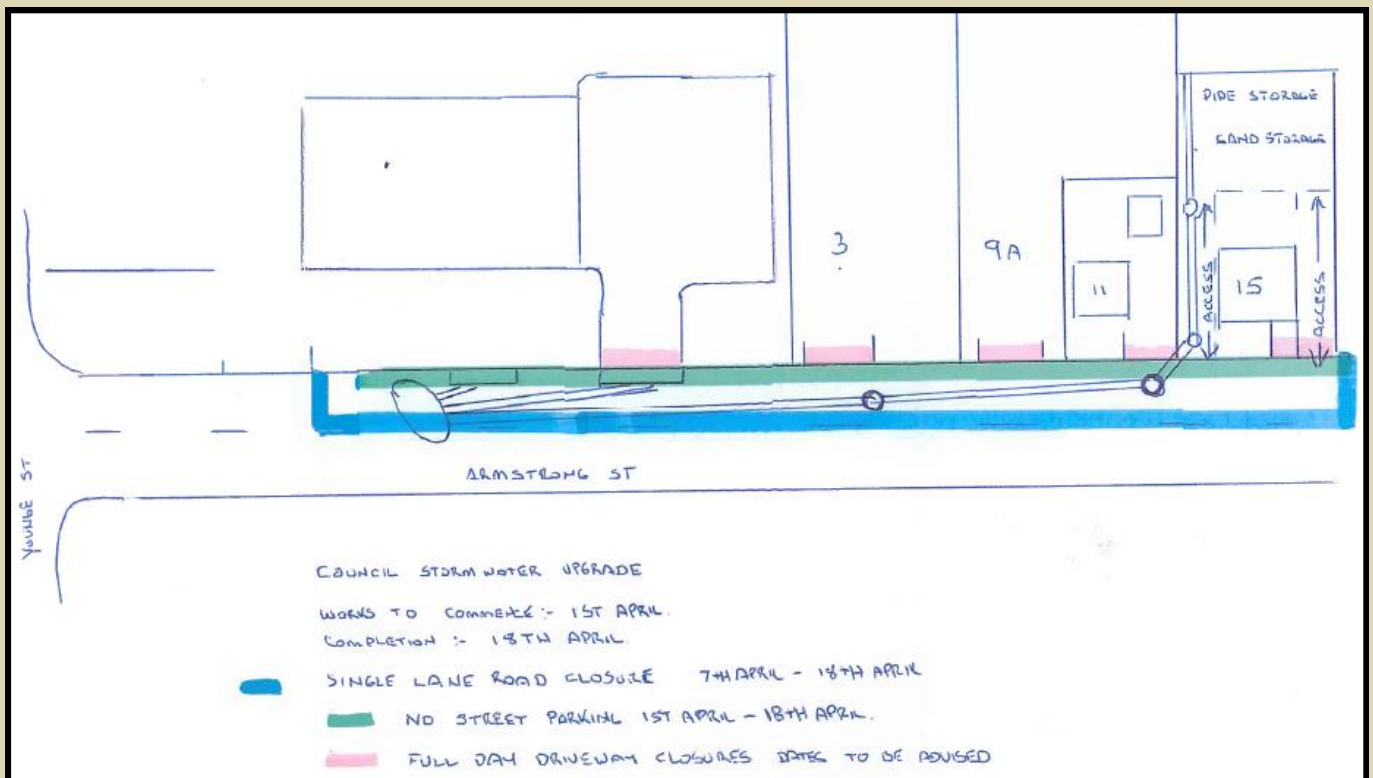
